What kind of research might you take part in?

There are many different research studies that you may be interested in. Here are some of the recent studies that have been completed:

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Care home oral health training

- Online or face to face training package for staff
- To increase understanding and changes in practice



Nurse led pneumonia prevention: A pilot study of people living with frailty (Pneumo65)

- looking at diagnosis, treatment and management of respiratory illness and pneumonia
- residents provided swab and saliva samples and completed health questionnaires
- staff were interviewed on how they make decisions about diagnosis and treatment planning

Vivaldi

- Ground-breaking Public Health England study regarding Covid-19
- Looking at prevalence of virus and vaccine protection amongst residents and staff
- Regular PCR swabbing of residents and staff
- Series of blood tests from residents and staff
- Helped understand Covid-19 and save many lives across the country
